SCHOOL BUS REMINDER FOR DRIVERS

Stopping for a school bus is the law and buses can stop at any time -- so stay alert! When a bus is loading or unloading children, its upper red lights flash and a stop-sign arm extends. Drivers must stop and remain stopped until the arm folds away and the lights stop flashing. Leave at least 20 metres when stopped behind a bus and obey all signals before moving again. Where there is no physical median dividing lanes of travel, such as a four-way stop with only painted lines separating lanes of travel, vehicles must remain stopped in both directions until the red lights stop flashing. RRL ENHANCEMENTS COMING TO WARDS 1 AND 5 IN 2026

Brampton's Residential Rental Licensing (RRL) Program will continue in Wards 1 and 5 with important enhancements launching January 1, 2026. Building on two years of strengthened oversight, the extended program will introduce required landlord training, new licence classifications and updated program requirements. These improvements support the City's ongoing work to address illegal units, reduce safety risks and ensure all rentals meet building, fire and property standards. By enhancing RRL in Wards 1 and 5, Brampton is reinforcing accountability, improving enforcement and continuing to advance safe, legal, well-maintained rental housing for residents. TRANSFORMING DOWNTOWN BRAMPTON - RIVERWALK GROUNDBREAKING

In November 2025, the City officially kicked off construction on the Downtown Brampton Flood Protection Project, the first phase of the Riverwalk project. This marks a significant milestone toward transforming the City's downtown core and protecting it from future events.

Beyond flood protection, Riverwalk will deliver substantial social and economic benefits. The project is expected to:

- Enable new development to accommodate approximately 17,700 new residents in downtown Brampton.
- Enable the creation of 23,800 jobs, including 2,200 construction-related positions during the building phase.
- Unlock 3.6 million square feet of new residential, retail and commercial space for development.




MAKE IT A FIRE-SAFE DECEMBER TO REMEMBER
