As summer unfolds, we're excited to continue building on the momentum of the past few months and working together to create safer, more connected neighbourhoods in Wards 2 & 6. It's been truly inspiring to see the energy, dedication and care that residents continue to bring to our communities and we remain committed to carrying that spirit forward.

This year, we've hosted three Town Hall meetings in Wards 2 & 6. Thank you to everyone who joined us — your participation made these events a success. It was a great opportunity to share updates on key local matters, such as the speed calming measures being implemented in your neighbourhoods and to hear your concerns. These meetings sparked meaningful conversations on community safety, with valuable support from Peel Regional Police, City's By-law Enforcement, Traffic Operations and the Community Safety and Well-Being Office. We're looking forward to continuing these conversations at our next Town Hall on July 24 at the Paul Palleschi Recreation Centre, from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm. We hope you'll join us for another great evening of community dialogue.

In May, we were proud to support Project E.R.A.S.E. (Eliminate Racing Activity on Streets Everywhere), an important initiative led by Peel Regional Police to address street racing and dangerous driving. This campaign promotes awareness and enforcement with public safety at its core. Street racing has no place in Brampton, and through education and strong partnerships, we're taking real steps to make our roads safer.

We also had the opportunity to visit the new Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) processing centre, located right here in Ward 2. This is an exciting development for community safety, with 185 ASE cameras expected to be installed by the end of summer 2025. We're proud to support bold, proactive measures like this that are designed to make our neighbourhoods safer for everyone.

Looking ahead, we're thrilled to announce our second annual Wards 2 & 6 Community BBQ, taking place on September 7, 2025, from 1 pm to 3 pm, at Creditview Sandalwood Park. This is a wonderful opportunity to come together as a community, enjoy great food and conversation, and connect in a welcoming environment. Events like this help strengthen community bonds, celebrate our shared progress and build the kind of city we all want to live in.

We're grateful for your continued support and involvement, and we look forward to seeing you at one of our upcoming events. Have a safe, joyful and relaxing summer!

MAKING BRAMPTON ROADS SAFER

Brampton's Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program is one of the largest in Canada, with 150 cameras currently deployed and plans to expand to 185 cameras in Community Safety Zones across the city. These cameras help reduce speeding and improve safety in key areas such as school zones, parks and other community spaces. By encouraging drivers to comply with posted speed limits, the ASE program plays a vital role in making roads safer for pedestrians, cyclists and all road users. NOISE CONCERNS IN THE COMMUNITY

Persistent or disruptive noise can impact the comfort and safety of residents. If the noise is caused by disputes or moving vehicles, report it to Peel Regional Police by calling **905.453.3311**. For emergencies, call **911**. For other noise issues on City property, call **311**.



GARBAGE & DEBRIS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Be a good neighbour and remember to store waste bins in a secure location, keep the lids of the bin closed and avoid overfilling. Dumping garbage on public or private property is illegal and can lead to fines. Learn more at brampton.ca/bylaws



REPORT A PARKING INFRACTION

There's a right way to park – and a wrong way. If you notice a vehicle parked incorrectly on City property, help keep our streets safe and accessible by reporting it. Call 311 or visit brampton.ca/parking for more information.

Whether you're organizing a street festival, marathon or indoor gathering on City property, a Special Event Advisory Team (SEAT) application must be submitted 90 days prior to your public event.
