As we welcome the summer season, we're excited for the warmer weather and the amazing amenities and awesome events our city offers. As your representatives for Wards 3 & 4, we are happy to provide an update on the changes happening in our city, as we continue to see progress on initiatives that matter most to our residents.

Over the past few months, our priority has been to increase our community engagement by providing strategic communication and feedback forums to our residents. We recently hosted two Community Town Halls in Council Chambers with a focus on park enhancements, the Hazel McCallion Line and road calming measures in May and property standards, By-law enforcement and Service Brampton updates in June. Bringing resident concerns to Council and finding solutions continues to be our focus.

The City has also taken proactive steps to improve parking compliance and public safety. Building on the City's investment in hiring 38 additional By-law Officers and two support positions, we have amended the Administrative Penalties (Parking) By-law to introduce higher fines for repeat parking offences, reinforcing our commitment to improving road safety and traffic management.

We have heard your concerns related to the Charolais Boulevard bike lanes and are soliciting your feedback. Please scan the QR code below to participate in a survey concerning the bike lanes.

In April, we were proud to celebrate the official opening of the new cricket pitch at Turner Fenton Secondary School. As the cricket capital of Canada, this new pitch is another milestone in our commitment to growing the sport and making it more accessible.

We are also proud to announce that the City of Brampton is the first municipality in Canada to offer free recreation memberships to residents aged 65 and older. BUSINESS LICENSING APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS

If you operate a business in Brampton, you may need a valid business licence from the City. The Municipal Act allows municipalities to determine which businesses require an operating licence. Depending on the type of licence, approvals from other departments and agencies may be required. Licensing Inspectors are on the streets daily to seek out unlicenced vehicles, unlicenced businesses and monitor licenced mobile and stationary businesses. MAKING BRAMPTON ROADS SAFER

Brampton's Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program is one of the largest in Canada, with 150 cameras currently deployed and plans to expand to 185 cameras in Community Safety Zones across the city. These cameras help reduce speeding and improve safety in key areas such as school zones, parks and other community spaces. By encouraging drivers to comply with posted speed limits, the ASE program plays a vital role in making roads safer for pedestrians, cyclists and all road users. BUILDING A MORE VIBRANT DOWNTOWN

Exciting changes are happening in downtown Brampton! Supported by a dedicated investment of \$23.8 million through the 2025 City Budget, including the revitalization of Main and Queen Streets, featuring improvements to roads, sidewalks, lighting, street furniture and landscaping and the reconstruction of Ken Whillans Square.

Demolition of City-owned properties at 30 to 60 Main Street North is underway, marking a major milestone paving the way to create more vibrant and accessible public spaces. After the demolition, Garden Square will be temporarily expanded to create more usable space for the community and events while long-term plans for the Heritage Theatre and Southern Blocks move forward. NOISE CONCERNS IN THE COMMUNITY




REPORT A PARKING INFRACTION

PARKS UPDATES

We've been hard at work getting ready for the summer and improving our parks and recreation amenities in Wards 3 & 4. Over the last year, we've made upgrades to several parks and work is currently underway to add new playgrounds, shade shelters and recreational courts.

Construction is also underway at Monkton Circle Park, a new park located in Ward 4 that will include basketball, tennis and pickleball courts, a playground, splash pad and more for our community. We anticipate construction will wrap up toward the end of 2025.

GRASS & WEED CONTROL OPERATIONS

We've officially launched our seasonal grass cutting and weed control operation for this year! Crews are cutting grass based on area needs and managing invasive plants to support local biodiversity. Operations to keep more than 850 parks and green spaces clean and vibrant will continue through October. Maintenance of parks and green space will be determined by type:

- High-maintenance areas (e.g., sports fields) will be cut weekly to ensure they are safe and accessible.
- Medium-maintenance areas (e.g., parklands, boulevards) will be cut every two weeks.
- Low-maintenance areas (e.g., stormwater ponds, valley lands) will be cut six times this season.

Crews have also started managing weed growth in City parks, roads and sports fields in areas that invasive species grow. Longer grass and weeds support wildlife and pollinators, and as a Bee City everyone plays a part. The City encourages residents to leaving dandelions to grow but there are natural way you can manage them:

- Mow at three inches.
- Mow regularly to remove the flower heads before they go to seed, therefore preventing seeds from spreading. Alternatively, pick off the yellow heads by hand.
- Mulch tree and shrub beds to prevent growth and seeds from establishing.
- Use a weeding tool to pull out the plant and the root by hand.
