MAKING BRAMPTON ROADS SAFER

Brampton's Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program is one of the largest in Canada, with 150 cameras currently deployed and plans to expand to 185 cameras in Community Safety Zones across the city. These cameras help reduce speeding and improve safety in key areas such as school zones, parks and other community spaces. By encouraging drivers to comply with posted speed limits, the ASE program plays a vital role in making roads safer for pedestrians, cyclists and all road users. IS YOUR SMOKE ALARM STILL WORKING FOR YOU?

Did you know that smoke alarms don't last forever and must be replaced every 10 years to keep your home and family safe? Check the date on your smoke alarm and replace it if it is expired or showing signs of malfunction, like frequent false alarms, chirping or failure to respond during testing. When replacing smoke alarms, ensure the new alarms provide the same level of protection as the existing ones. Regular maintenance and timely replacement save lives. Stay fire safe and informed. NOISE CONCERNS IN THE COMMUNITY

Persistent or disruptive noise can impact the comfort and safety of residents. If the noise is caused by disputes or moving vehicles, report it to Peel Regional Police by calling **905.453.3311**. For emergencies, call **911**. For other noise issues on City property, call **311**.



GARBAGE & DEBRIS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Be a good neighbour and remember to store waste bins in a secure location, keep the lids of the bin closed and avoid overfilling. Dumping garbage on public or private property is illegal and can lead to fines. Learn more at brampton.ca/bylaws



REPORT A PARKING INFRACTION

There's a right way to park – and a wrong way. If you notice a vehicle parked incorrectly on City property, help keep our streets safe and accessible by reporting it. Call 311 or visit brampton.ca/parking for more information.

PLANNING AN EVENT ON CITY PROPERTY?

Whether you're organizing a street festival, marathon or indoor gathering on City property, a Special Event Advisory Team (SEAT) application must be submitted 90 days prior to your public event. PAYING YOUR ASE TICKET

Received an Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) ticket? You have 30 days from the deemed service date to pay or appeal. Pay online, by phone, in person or by mail. Include your ticket number when paying. Visit brampton.ca/asepayment for more information.

KEEP BRAMPTON CLEAN: TRACK STREET SWEEPING IN REAL TIME

Spring and summer bring street sweeping to Brampton and now, thanks to the City of Brampton's Street Sweeping Tracking Tool, you can monitor when and where crews are working—right from your phone or computer.

What Is the Street Sweeping Tracking Tool?

This interactive online map shows which neighbourhoods are scheduled for sweeping, which streets have been completed and when crews are expected to return. It's updated in real time so you can plan ahead.

How to Use the Tool:

1. Visit: brampton.ca/streetsweeping
2. Enter your address or zoom into your area on the map.
3. Check color codes to see sweeping status:

- Completed
- In progress
- Scheduled

Set reminders to move your car if needed, so sweepers can do a thorough job.

Help Us Help You!

Parked vehicles can block sweepers, leaving your street partially cleaned. Make sure to follow signs or use the tracking tool to move your car ahead of time.

HOW TO REPORT REFUSE & DEBRIS

Litter and illegal dumping can make even the most beautiful neighbourhood look neglected. The good news? Reporting it is easy—and it makes a real difference.

What Can You Report?

- Household trash or bulky waste left on curbs
- Construction debris or illegal dumping
- Overflowing public bins or windblown litter

How to Report:

- Online: Use the City's Service Brampton portal at brampton.ca/311
- Call 311: Speak directly with a customer service representative
- Use the 311 App: Snap a photo, enter a location and submit within seconds

Tips for a Helpful Report:

- Include the exact address or nearby landmark
- Upload a clear photo
- Choose the correct issue category for faster processing

What Happens Next?

Once reported, the City sends a crew to assess and clean up the site—often within 24–48 hours. You can even track your service request through the portal.



TRACK GRASS CUTTING WITH OUR NEW ONLINE TOOL

As part of our commitment to maintaining vibrant, clean and green public spaces, the City has launched the Grass Cutting Tracker Tool — a user-friendly online feature that lets residents track when City-owned parks and boulevards were last maintained.

This innovative tool gives residents transparency and insight into our seasonal grass maintenance operations. Whether you're out for a walk in the park or simply want to stay informed about your neighbourhood, the Grass Cutting Tracker puts real-time information at your fingertips.

How It Works

- Interactive Map View: See a colour-coded map of Brampton that shows grass cutting status.
- Search by Address or Park Name: Easily find the most recent cutting date for specific locations.
- Updated Regularly: The tool is refreshed frequently throughout the week to reflect current mowing activities.

Why This Matters

Keeping grass at an optimal height is more than just about looks. Well-maintained green spaces:

- Promote community pride and well-being
- Deter pests and invasive species
- Support healthy growth of trees and native plants
- Encourage safer, more enjoyable public use
