SESQUICENTENNIAL PARK ACTIVITY HUB

Brampton's third activity hub is complete! Located at 11333 Bramalea Road, the hub is fully accessible, featuring innovative play structures and recreational elements for all ages and abilities. TMU SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

In January 2023, the City of Brampton and the Province of Ontario announced Bramalea Civic Centre will be the new home of the Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU) School of Medicine.

Construction begins this fall. City staff are relocating organizations using the centre: Peel Region, Muslim Community Services, Brampton Multicultural Community Centre, Malton Neighbourhood Services, Royal Bank, Kinderkollege, and Canadian South Asians Supporting Independent Living.

The Chinguacousy Branch Library has relocated to Chinguacousy Park. Lester B. Pearson Theatre and adjacent studio space will be used jointly by the City and TMU. Learn more at **www.torontomu.ca/school-of-medicine**

SUSAN FENNELL SPORTSPLEX YOUTH HUB NOW OPEN!

The new youth hub is a dedicated space with a variety of unstructured spaces that allow youth to freely socialize and connect. Young people can access programming and supports, while building meaningful friendships and connections. Other amenities in the space include an eSports area, sponsored by Sheridan College, a creative space, ideation rooms, and a lounge area.

Youth hubs add to the growing amenities available for young people within the city, prioritizing safe, inclusive, and supportive communities. BRAMPTON FORWARD: FAIR DEAL FOR INDEPENDENCE

On May 18, 2023, the Province of Ontario introduced Bill 112, Hazel McCallion Act, to make Brampton, Caledon, and Mississauga single-tier municipalities and dissolve the Region of Peel by January 1, 2025. The provincial government has established a five-member transition board to facilitate this change and oversee Peel's financial affairs to ensure prudent financial stewardship until the Region is dissolved. The City of Brampton looks forward to independence and discussions with the Province of Ontario and our regional partners on the division of services like police, paramedics, waste management, and other supports for our rapidly growing city. SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM MAINTENANCE TIPS

House fires can be devastating, causing a great deal of property damage and putting your family at risk. Maintenance ensures your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms keep you safe.

- Install working smoke alarms on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas.
- Install working carbon monoxide alarms beside all sleeping areas.
- Test alarms monthly.
- Replace alarms that are 10 years old or older.
- Replace batteries at least once a year.


SNOW REMOVAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The City of Brampton has a financial assistance program for seniors and physically challenged homeowners to help with costs for removing snow from sidewalks and driveways. PERMITS REQUIRED TO DISPLAY SIGNS

Permits must be requested to display signs on buildings or in the ground in Brampton. All signs, temporary or permanent, are regulated to help keep pedestrians and drivers safe from distractions and avoid visual clutter in the city. FIREWORKS BAN

Under the Fireworks By-law, the use, purchase, discharge, possession, display, sale, and offer to sell of fireworks is strictly prohibited in Brampton. Penalties for failing to comply range from \$500 to \$1,000 and may reach up to \$100,000 if a court summons is issued. The City is dedicated to creating an inclusive environment. Residents are invited to celebrate Canada Day, Diwali, and New Year's Eve at City-led events with Pyrotechnics. Learn more at www.brampton.ca/fireworks



ACCESSIBLE PARKING

As the City continues to develop and expand, the number of people requiring barrier-free parking also increases. Access to accessible parking is important for people with disabilities to be able to enjoy services and facilities. Accessible Parking Permits are issued free of charge to qualified individuals through the Province of Ontario. Under the Traffic By-law, owners and operators of businesses are required to provide for and maintain accessible parking spaces. Learn more at

SANDALWOOD HEIGHTS ADVENTURE PARK (SHAP)

Sandalwood Heights Adventure Park will be adjacent to the existing Torbram Sandalwood Community Park. The construction of the new park will further enhance the site as a universally accessible park. The park is anticipated to be fully open in 2025.

GORE MEADOWS COMMUNITY PARK

Phase 2 of Gore Meadows East Community Park is anticipated to be fully open in 2025.

FIRST TAPE BALL CRICKET PITCH IN BRAMPTON

There's a new way to play cricket in Brampton now that the first-ever dedicated tape ball pitch has opened in the city. Located at Brampton's Chris Gibson Park, the tape ball grounds opened in August and offers cricket players a different, low-impact way to play the game.

Tape ball is cricket played with a tennis ball wrapped in electrical tape. The game is played in a smaller area than traditional hardball cricket and doesn't require any specialty equipment to play.

With an artificial pitch, sight screen, lights and bleachers, the new tape ball grounds will provide more access to players in Brampton.
