Brampton is actively moving forward with initiatives to create jobs and promote innovation and entrepreneurship within the city.

Two initiatives that the City is launching in collaboration with Ryerson University deserve special mention: the pilot incubator space and Cybersecure Catalyst.

The Ryerson-led incubator and collaborative workspace, located in downtown Brampton at 41 George Street, will support emerging start-ups.

Ryerson's Cybersecure Catalyst will be a national centre for cybersecurity, offering training and certification, research and development, and commercial innovation in the critical field of cyber security. It will help build Brampton's reputation as a global player in this exciting space.

\$15 SENIOR MONTHLY PASS

Brampton Council approved a Brampton Transit \$15 senior monthly pass for senior riders, 65 years of age and older, who are residents of Brampton. Brampton Transit is working on an implementation plan and the goal is to launch the pass later this year/early next year. To load the \$15 monthly pass, you will be required to have a registered PRESTO card and a Brampton Transit issued Senior ID card. Proof of age and residency will be required to obtain a Brampton Transit issued Senior ID card. 


Do you live in a rented property? Did you know that the City's Zoning By-law prohibits more than three lodgers or boarders from residing together in one dwelling unit? These rules are in place to ensure suitable living conditions and to avoid overcrowding which could pose various risks to your health and safety. When searching for rental listings, if the unit you plan to rent is a basement apartment, make sure

the unit is legal. Check the webpage www.brampton.ca/secondunits to see if the rental property is registered with the City.







GORE MEADOWS COVERED OUTDOOR ICE RINK

On February 3, the City hosted a grand opening of the Gore Meadows Covered Outdoor Ice Rink. Located at 10150 The Gore Road, the outdoor rink's unique roof covering and design protects the artificial ice from the elements. In winter, the rink is sized for public skates, lessons and shinny. In the summer, the space can be converted for events, recreation programs, camps and ball hockey. Amenities onsite include two accessible washrooms and one universal change room with lockers. Personal sound amplifying devices and hearingimpaired earphones are also available for hearingimpaired patrons to use as they skate.

BRAMPTON SOCCER CENTRE

The Brampton Soccer Centre is being transformed into an indoor/outdoor multi-sport facility. The biggest change is the construction of a new, air-supported dome over one outdoor field. Two outdoor fields are being converted to artificial turf with lights to make the fields suitable for a variety of sports, extend their playing season and reduce rain closures. A pavilion with washrooms and change rooms will be built to support the outdoor sports fields. Anticipated opening date is November 2019.

> We have a lot of parks upgrades taking place in our ward this summer, including:

- The construction of a new full-size cricket field at Gore Meadows Community Centre, which will include spectator seating
- A new shade shelter at Great Lakes Park
