A public meeting with respect to the above referenced development proposal will be held at the March 7th, 2022 Planning and Development Committee meeting. The notice for the public meeting is enclosed and will inform you of the details of the proposal.

The purpose and effect of the application is to application. redevelop the subject lands for a mixed-use development. The details of the proposal are as follows:

- 26 storeys in height
- 400 residential units •
- 470 square metres (5059 square feet) of ground floor commercial
- 234 vehicle parking spaces and 215 bicycle parking spaces.
- Floor Space Index:4.61
- Site Coverage: 42.9%

Important Information about making a submission

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Brampton with respect to a proposed official plan amendment or proposed zoning by-law amendment before a zoning bylaw is passed, or before a proposed official plan amendment is adopted:

(a) The person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the City of Brampton to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal; and,

(b) The person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City in respect to a proposed plan of subdivision, on a zoning by-law amendment, adoption of an official plan amendment, or of the refusal of a request to amend the official plan, you must make a written request to the Clerk, City of Brampton, 2 Wellington Street West Brampton, ON L6Y 4R2.

City Council will not adopt a proposed Official Plan Amendment or enact a proposed Zoning By-law or approve in principle a plan of subdivision until at least 30 days after the date of a statutory public meeting.
