Purpose and Effect

In January 2019, Council passed a motion (C024-2019) directing staff to move forward with hiring a consultant to explore opportunities for the use of a Community Improvement Plan (CIP) to incentivize employment growth throughout the City.

The City hired the consulting services of NBLC to complete an employment study to determine the appropriateness of preparing a Community Improvement Plan (CIP). The employment study was completed in November of 2020, and endorsed by Council in March 2021. The study recommended that the City proceed with implementing a CIP for a prescribed period of time offering incentives for eligible office uses. A CIP allows a municipality to offer financial and other assistance to the private sector to achieve specific employment objectives.

The purpose of this public meeting is to present a by-law that proposes to establish a city-wide Community Improvement Plan (CIP) to attract office employment across the City through the following incentives:

- A 10-year Tax Increment Equivalent Grant (TIEG) to offset the municipal property tax increase:
- Utilization of the Region of Peel Major Office Incentive Tax Increment Equivalent Grant (TIEG) to offset the regional tax increase; and,
- Strengthening the City's expedited planning review process.

City Council will not adopt a proposed Official Plan Amendment until at least 30 days after the date of a statutory public meeting

Important Information about making a submission

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Brampton with respect to a proposed official plan amendment before the proposed official plan amendment is adopted:

- (a) The person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the City of Brampton to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal; and,
- (b) The person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.
