



Notice of Passing of By-law 21-2018 to amend Interim Control By-law 246-2017 Applicable to Part of the area subject to Zoning By-law 270-2004 Wards 1 and 3

On the date noted above, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brampton passed By-law 21-2018 to amend Interim Control By-law 246-2017, applicable to part of the area subject to Zoning By-law 270-2004, as amended, under Section 38 of the *Planning Act,* R.S.O., c.P.13, as amended.

The Purpose and Effect: To permit a place of commercial use within an existing building at the subject property at 239 Queen Street East.

Location of Lands: Property is located 239 Queen Street East, within Part of Blocks A and B, Registered Plan 518.

Council Authority: Council has the authority to extend the period during which the by-law will be in effect to a total period not exceeding two years.

Obtaining Additional Information: A key map showing the lands to which the by-law applies is attached. The complete by-law and background materials are available for inspection at the City Clerk's Office during regular office hours, or online at www.brampton.ca. When and How to File an Appeal: An appeal of the by-law amendment to the Ontario Municipal Board must be filed with the Clerk of the City of Brampton **no later than April 23, 2018**. An appeal form is available from the OMB website at www.omb.gov.ca

The Notice of Appeal must:

- (1) set out the reasons for appeal; and,
- (2) be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board in the amount of \$300.00 payable by certified cheque or money order to the Minister of Finance, Province of Ontario.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal an interim control by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB). A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.
