#### **Purpose and Effect**

Municipalities may only permit conversion of employment lands to non-employment uses through a municipally initiated Municipal Comprehensive Review (MCR) through which it has been demonstrated that employment land conversion criteria have been met as set out in the City's Official Plan.

The City retained consulting services to undertake the MCR. In addition, two background studies were undertaken to assist the City in this review.

As part of the MCR process, the City reviewed 13 sites for conversion to non-employment uses.

The purpose of this open house meeting is to present draft recommendations on the MCR, prior to reporting back to Council with final recommendations for each of the sites proposed for employment conversion.

Of the 13 sites, 3 are recommended for total conversion, 1 site is recommended for partial re-designation from Industrial to Business Corridor, and the 9 remaining sites are not recommended for conversion.
