COMMUNITY SAFETY AND WELL-BEING IN BRAMPTON

- The Ontario Police Services Act (effective January 1, 2019) requires municipalities to develop and adopt community safety and well-being plans
- Community Safety & Well-Being Office (CSWO) was established in 2021 as a Term of Council Priority during the Mid-Term Refresh and Evaluation
- CSWO is within the Community Services department
- Divides the City into four community safety quadrants (NW, NE, SW, SE) by utilizing Highway 410 and Williams Parkway
- Complements and works alongside the Peel Community Safety and Well-Being Plan
- Levels of intervention: social development; prevention; risk intervention; incident response

Brampton's first **Community Safety Action Plan** is an initiative of the City of Brampton Community Safety & Well-Being Office and was identified as an intergovernmental priority supporting the strategic direction that Brampton is a Healthy and Safe City.

The Community Safety and Well-Being Office is collaborating with internal partners across all departments. It is informed by town halls, resident meetings, Citizen Advisory Committee strategy session, City Council interviews, staff and external partner engagement, and data from 1,800+ residents through the Nurturing Neighbourhoods Program.



SAFETY

CSWO will work alongside residents to become aware of and address safety concerns.



AWARENESS

CSWO will work to create awareness of community information and resources.



EMPOWERMENT

CSWO will work to empower residents and build capacity to take action towards enhancing safety and well-being in their neighbourhoods.
