

## Eastbourne Park Restoration and Eco Space Project

In collaboration with the City of Brampton, Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) is implementing a stream restoration project in Eastbourne Park to remove the concrete lining from Mimico Creek's channel and restore it to a more natural, meandering form. Small wetlands are being created to filter stormwater before it enters the creek. This project will address erosion issues and improve water quality, flood mitigation, and aquatic habitat. Although most trees and shrubs were removed from the channel restoration area, more native trees are being planted along the stream and throughout the park to stabilize the site, improve wildlife habitat, and provide shade.

The City of Brampton and TRCA are also exploring opportunities to integrate additional park amenities through the Bramalea Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Program (SNAP) and the Brampton Eco Park Strategy. A concept plan, developed with community input, proposes a Tiny Forest, Creek Lookout, Pedestrian Bridge, Pollinator Habitat, Community-led Art Projects, and Play Nodes. The City of Brampton and TRCA are working to incorporate these features, pending funding, and will continue engaging the community.

## Activity Timelines:

- Channel Restoration Phase 1 – Fall 2022 to Spring 2024 (Completed)
- Channel Restoration Phase 2 – Summer 2025 to Fall 2025
- Tree and Tiny Forest Planting: 2023 to 2025
- Footbridge Installation: 2025
- Pollinator Habitat Planting: 2025

\* *The trail will be re-paved after Channel Restoration is completed. Timelines are subject to change.*
