






BALMORAL RECREATION CENTRE

Balmoral Recreation Centre is undergoing a significant renovation which will maintain the existing pool structure but provide new construction that will double the size of the facility to 35,000 square feet. Site improvements will expand the park and establish the Recreation Facility as an important hub in the community.

- Two multi-purpose rooms
- Sauna
- Universal change room
- Splash pad and playground
- Exterior washrooms
- New landscaping and parking spaces




RIVERSTONE COMMUNITY CENTRE

This project aims to enhance existing public spaces in the facility, including a redesign and renovation of basement level changerooms, expansion of the Fitness Centre including an additional studio, and creating community use and facility support spaces.

Enhancements to:

- Lower-level washroom and changerooms
- Group fitness studio
- Community room





MEMORIAL ARENA

Memorial Arena will undergo a 3,000-square-foot addition featuring two new changerooms with shower and washroom, office and equipment rooms, and storage spaces.

This addition will complement the building design while respecting the historic architectural integrity of the existing building.

Project Timeline:

- Q4 2024 Construction start
- Q4 2025 Estimated project completion

The Susan Fennell Sportsplex was selected as Brampton's first net-zero carbon facility, advancing the City's commitment to combat climate change and achieve its 2050 net-zero goals. This comprehensive retrofit also addresses aging equipment throughout the facility.

This transformation represents a significant milestone in Brampton's environmental leadership and community infrastructure renewal.


Project Timeline:

EARNSCLIFFE PARK CRICKET FACILITY

The City of Brampton will be welcoming its first year-round cricket facility at Earnscliffe Park. The new facility will include a turf cricket field, five-lane batting cage, a comfort station and a seasonal dome, addressing the need for winterized amenities.

This development is designed to meet the growing demand for cricket amenities and will serve both local and international user groups, offering year-round recreational opportunities for all ages and skill levels.

Project Timeline:

- Turf cricket field with seasonal dome
- Five-lane batting cage
- Comfort station






CASSIE CAMPBELL FIELD HOCKEY DOMED TURF FIELD

This facility will provide a second competition grade turf field for field hockey play on the main space. Additional training space will be provided for cricket and baseball batting/pitching cages as well as an indoor track with long jump pits. The entire facility will be enclosed with a year-round dome with an attached pavilion to service the needs of the athletes on site.

- Dry turf field for field hockey
- Batting/hitting tunnels for cricket and baseball training
- Indoor track training lanes
- Two sand pits for long jump and triple jump
- Pavilion with change room and washrooms
- Updated site work and landscaping
- New pathways and parking
- Exterior lighting for the dome






CENTURY GARDENS YOUTH HUB

The former Lawn Bowling Club facility and grounds will be demolished to make way for a new 12,500 square foot youth hub space that will feature youth-oriented design and activities, including games and e-sports, group education and career advice, social services and more. The adjacent lands to the youth hub will provide activity space for youth to play games, grow gardens and gather for special events.

The original Victoria Park arena was destroyed by fire in 2016. Plans to resurrect the arena as a dry-pad space that could accommodate the needs of multiple sports resulted in a beautiful wood floor arena design with gallery seating for 500 spectators. The opportunity to showcase Brampton's rich sports history presented itself through this project as well, so the Brampton Sports Hall of Fame will make a new home in Victoria Park Arena when it is complete.

- Full-size dry multi-sport wooden floor
- Gallery seating for 500 people (including accessible spaces)
- Change rooms and office space for teams using space for training
- Multi-purpose room
- Brampton Sports Hall of Fame (4,000 sq. ft. dedicated space)




