Thank you for your comments. The City's vision is to redevelop Rosalea Park, as well as the surrounding Etobicoke Creek and downtown Brampton area, into an improved public open/park space for use of by all members of the community. The City is currently undertaking other studies (e.g. Urban Design Master Plan, Downtown Brampton Flood Protection, Riverwalk Project) to determine these improvements that will support better spaces for pedestrians and cyclists while also accommodating floodplain requirements. The City's vision to revitalize this area would support the age-friendly principles that are important to you and your facility as the green/park space now would be enhanced in Rosalea Park and adjacent to Etobicoke Creek, so that residents can better enjoy the use of these features. This road extension study is not intended to reduce or eliminate Rosalea Park but rather to complement and support access to the improved park space the City envisions in this area.

As we are still in the early stage of the Ken Whillans Drive Extension EA study, various alternatives are being explored and developed, and no recommended decision has been made. The purpose of the EA study is to determine the recommended road alignment and right-of-way (ROW) alternatives by evaluating the alternatives for how well they address criteria including, but not limited to, the City's vision, traffic needs, active transportation, safety, public use and placemaking, and impacts to the natural and cultural environment. The G.R.A.C.E. Inc Board is opposed to the extension of Ken Whillans Drive. The extension will reduce the amount of green space in Rosalea Park. This reduction in green space will impact the Grace Court seniors and the seniors at 1 Maple Avenue.

Grace Court is a 65-unit apartment building for low-income seniors overlooking Rosalea Park. Beside Grace Court, at 1 Maple Avenue, is a 101-unit low-income senior apartment building.

Low-income seniors experienced vulnerability and marginalization before COVI19. COVID-19 has had a disproportionately negative impact on both low-income communities and seniors. COVID-19 has increased our awareness of how important mental health is for the overall wellness of seniors. Parks, like Rosalea, provide mental health benefits to our seniors.

A public green space, like Rosalea Park, is invaluable to our community. Parks serve residents culturally, as they inspire and provide recreational opportunities. Seniors with higher income levels can easily access green areas, but low-income seniors, like those at Grace Court, have limited access to public spaces. Rosalea Park is steps from Grace Court. Our Seniors are concerned about the loss of green space within walking distance.

The City of Brampton website states: "The City is working to become a leader in agefriendliness by ensuring that the aging community has access to necessary services, is valued and able to contribute to civic life, and has a suitable environment with strong supports in which they can remain healthy and age safely, with purpose and dignity."

In addition, the City is pursing admission into the World Health Organization's (WHO) Network of Age-Friendly Cities and Communities. The city is committed to advancing public and policy goals that align with the WHO's eight established focus areas that define an age-friendly community. One WHO focus area is outdoor spaces and public buildings that are pleasant, clean, secure and physically accessible.

The proposed extension of Ken Whillans Drive will pave over existing green space in Rosalea Park. The reduction of green space is contrary to the City's stated desire to make outdoor spaces secure and detrimental to the City's desire to seek admission to the WHO's Network of Age-Friendly Cities.

We believe that the downtown community will be better served by more green space rather than by paving over existing green space.

The current proposal for Ken W extension is a "soft" use road and not a regularily used high traffic street. The best I can make of the proposed road is it will be like the Gage Park road that is used for events but is not a short cut for commuters. Given its location it currently is a shortcut from nowhere to Church Street or Vodden. But there is a high rise planned on Nelson and it could be a potential shortcut to Church Street. Church Street will become a very busy street, with access to Kennedy, once all the highrises are built north of the tracks.

The proposed route hugs the edge of the park and I do not think it interfers with Grace Court pedestrian access to the YMCA. However, lights at Church and Ken W would make for a safer road crossing for seniors walking from Grace Court area to Church and Main.

Future Riverwalk concepts for Rosalea Park may be a bigger noise problem for the local seniors. I think of the Gage Park and Market Square noise levels. The Grace Court seniors do not all have air conditioning and leave their windows open in the summer.

The current Ken W proposal makes sense if events liked the farmers market or a bandstand/concert are held in Rosalea. This may be the ultimate plan. While it would be nice if the park was just for local seniors we probably have to accept the wider community use. We are downtown.

However I would rather spend the Ken W money on the Scott Street Bridge and a new hospital.

Given the changing priorities at City Hall the Riverwalk project, which includes a new Scott Street Bridge, could be a decade(s) away. In the meantime the only access to the Scott/Maple area (mostly seniors) is a very poorly designed light at Queen & Scott. I have asked for a better designed intersection at Queen and Scott and the City did open a service request number - 332259. So far no changes, except a sign that says "do not block the intersection". The seniors and their caregivers deserve a better access, one that allows for a safe turn east at Scott & Queen or for a new Scott Street Bridge.

Thank you for your comments and your attendance at the Stakeholder Group Meeting. You are correct in that the design of the Ken Whillans extension will not be designed / look like a regularly used high traffic road. That is similar to Option 4 (Conventional Street) we presented at the Stakeholder Meeting. Rather this street will use different paver types, colours, surfaces to delineate space rather than conventional asphalt, pavement markings, and curbs. Based on the preliminary design, there will be no impacts to Grace Court and Grace Court pedestrian access to the YMCA and Rosalea Park.

We have confirmed that the future plans for Rosalea Park do not include the amphitheatre and permanent stage. Note that the plans for Rosalea Park are at a very preliminary stage and are concepts that will be developed further in future phases.

The reconstruction of the Scott Street bridge is planned to be implemented along with Riverwalk projects, however some renovations to improve pedestrian use and accessibility are planned for this summer.



Comments/Area of Interest:

The extension of Ken Whillans Drive south of Church Street East will create more problems:

- 1. Traffic along Church Street is already very heavy, especially in the mornings and afternoons. With this area containing a high senior population, it is important to consider the safety concerns of increasing traffic within this area. A study done by Etehad et. al (2015) entitled "Impact of road traffic accidents on the elderly" concluded that the senior population experienced high rates of mortality and morbidity with increasing road traffic.
- 2. Aside from the safety concerns, there are also a number of health concerns that seniors are more vulnerable to when living nearby high traffic areas. There are a number of studies showing the increasing risks of dementia, Parkinson's disease and other diseases for seniors who are nearby high traffic areas.
- 3. By adding this roadway extension, requires elimination of the greenspace within the Rosalea Park. Reducing greenspace means reducing the availability of walking trails for nearby seniors, especially those who have limited mobility to access other greenspace areas in Brampton. Outdoor exercise is important for mental and overall health for seniors, which will be more difficult to obtain with an added barrier and reduced greenspace from this roadway extension.
- 4. Eliminating greenspace has many other detrimental effects within our area slows climate change, prevents flooding, provides habitat for wildlife, improves mental health, provides a community space, and even increases our property values.

In conclusion, extending this roadway poses many health and safety concerns, and eliminates our precious and valuable greenspace - it is in the best interest of the public that this roadway is not constructed and the greenspace remains intact.

Thank you for your comments. The City's vision is to redevelop the Rosalea Park, Etobicoke Creek, and downtown Brampton area into an improved public open/park space. The City is currently undertaking other studies (e.g. Urban Design Master Plan, Downtown Brampton Flood Protection, River Walk Project) to determine these improvements that will support better spaces for both pedestrians and cyclists while also accommodating floodplain requirements. The City's vision to revitalize this area would support seniors' use of the area as the green/park space now would be enhanced in Rosalea Park and adjacent to Etobicoke Creek, so that seniors can better enjoy the use of these features. This road extension study is not intended to reduce or eliminate Rosalea Park but rather to complement and support access to the improved park space the City envisions in this area.







It is being designed for active transportation, street for events (Farmers' Market, etc.) in line with the objectives of Riverwalk, Urban Design Master Plan Study and Downtown Revitalization. The design of this road will not be a conventional road. The use of pavers, Streetscaping and design elements will reduce the speed of both cars and bicycles using this extension. Other speed mitigations design methods, such as speed bumps etc. can be reviewed during detailed design. The extension will improve on the current situation providing clear zones for cyclists and pedestrians and making it easier to determine where and when to check for cyclists when crossing.

You can access the preliminary design at this link (https://www.brampton.ca/EN/residents/Roads-and-Traffic/Planning-and-Projects/Pages/Ken-Whillans-Dr.aspx [brampton.ca]) which is a 30% design. You will not find much Streetscaping details at this stage as you may be aware that a Guide for Streetscaping is under preparation by City's Integrated Downtown Planning (IDP) team. After the EA is completed, the design team will take up the design to 100%.

I am writing to provide written commentary in support of our position previously expressed at public information forums on the development of the Downtown flood mitigation project along the Etobicoke Creek commonly known as *Riverwalk*. Specifically we wish to address a possible extension of Ken Whillans Pkwy south of Church St E.

I am a member of the Downtown Brampton BIA executive, but also speak as a downtown resident who utilizes Rosalea Park regularly for walks and recreation. We have spoken to an extension of Ken Whillans Pkwy at previous public information sessions, but wish to make it clear, our view is not to propose this extension as a usual vehicle thoroughfare. Rather we would propose the re-work of Ken Whillans as a new flexible access route offering a new link to the recreational, cultural, educational and small business assets surrounding the four corners. One

which would compliment the City's Downtown Revitalization plan which is approved and to commence shortly.

The Riverwalk development, particularly the area of Rosalea Park, offers an opportunity to rework Ken Whillans into a flexible route facilitating broadened use of the park and the adjacent recreational and cultural assets. We would propose a flexible access route capable of facilitating pedestrian, cyclists and vehicles, a true public gateway to Rosalea Park. Given the continued existence of Church Street, the new access lane could be periodically opened or closed to auto traffic while providing a continuous pedestrian & cycle boulevard where community markets similar to our Farmer's Market could be hosted. Or where public events such as art exhibits or a busters festival or a food festival could be staged utilizing the boulevard as a platform. A boulevard where pedestrian or cycling activity could naturally spread out incorporating the park as a juncture for all sorts of public activities without compromising regular recreational uses. Cultural & recreational events would be enhanced through a better link to adjacent assets, from the YMCA, the Tennis Club, the Rose Theatre, and Theatre Lane through to Garden Square. The extension of Ken Whillans could possibly facilitate improved pedestrian & cyclist access to Maple or Scott and Queen St East.

A re-work of Ken Whillans Pkwy including an extension to the south as a flexible boulevard would leverage public and private assets which already exist and broaden the use of the park with complementary public activities that ultimately contribute to the Downtown's *Placemaking* and compliment the surrounding residential, business and entertainment activities.

The DBBIA strongly supports an extension of Ken Whillans Pkwy to the south of Church St in the form of a flexible access route facilitating broadened use of the park and improved public access to the many assets surrounding the four corners.

We trust this proposal is given consideration in the design of the Riverwalk project and ultimately implementation.

Thanks again for meeting with us last Friday. I'm sending this email to summarize and follow up on a couple items that came up in the meeting. Action items are **bolded** below:

- I have added you to our Stakeholder Group. You'll get an email about the details of the Stakeholder Group meeting when we've set a date/time.
- Maintaining access to YMCA during construction is important as the road is the only full access to YMCA (the
 other access off Union Street is an exit only). While we won't be developing a detailed staging plan as part of the
 preliminary design and EA, we will incorporate commitments in the EA for detailed design that the City/designer
 consult with YMCA when developing the staging plan and that access must be maintained.
- There will be permanent property taking of a portion of YMCA's property for the road right-of-way of the Ken Whillans Drive extension.
- There will be some grading of the roadway on YMCA property. This will be a <u>temporary</u> easement for construction grading. Note that grading will likely impact some of the trees on YMCA property, however compensation for those trees can be discussed as part of property impacts discussion during detailed design.
- There will be geotechnical work in the form of drilling boreholes. All boreholes are along the centreline of the proposed road extension, which is all outside of YMCA's property. We anticipate that geotechnical work will occur at the end of February/March, but we will let you know once an exact date has been set.
- We are conducting a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for the proposed road alignment. As part of
 the Phase I ESA, our staff have to conduct an interview with the property owners about the site. Can you let me
 know who can take part in this interview and we will schedule a call. It shouldn't be more than 15-30 minutes,
 and usually is someone with some history of the site. They do not need to know the answer to all the questions,
 it's more so to see if the interview turns up any interesting or additional information we didn't find from
 historical records.
