

## NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

### Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

#### Arterial Roads within Highway 427 Industrial Secondary Plan Area (Area 47) – PART A

#### The Study

The City of Brampton (City), in partnership with the Region of Peel (Region), is conducting two Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Studies for the following roads:

#### Part A

- North-South Arterial (A2), a new north-south arterial roadway from Mayfield Road to Major Mackenzie Drive/Regional Road 50.
- Coleraine Drive from Mayfield Road to Arterial A2.

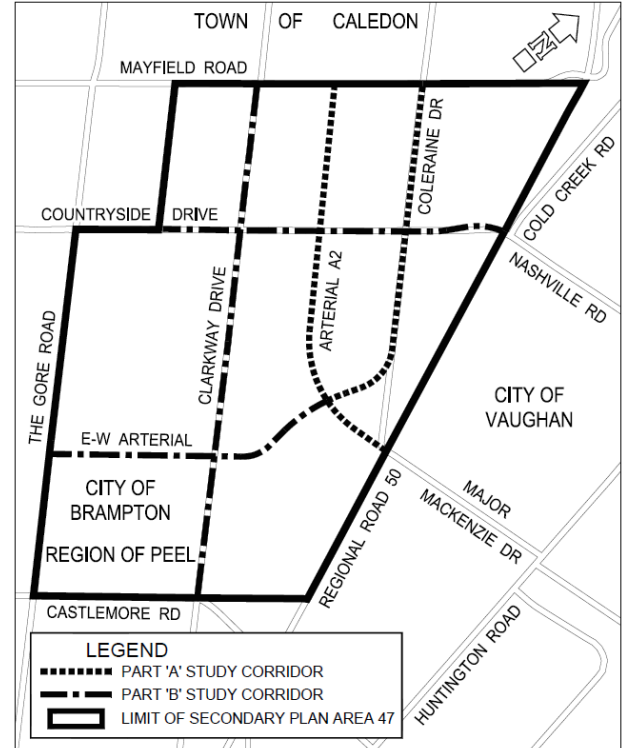
#### Part B

- East-West (E-W) Arterial, a new east-west minor arterial roadway from The Gore Road to Arterial A2.
- Clarkway Drive from Castlemore Road to Mayfield Road.
- Countryside Drive from west of Clarkway Drive to Regional Road 50 including possible realignment at Regional Road 50.

The Class EA Study for **Part A** has been completed. This notice is in relation to **Part A only**.

#### Recommended improvements under Part A include:

- New north-south 6-lane arterial roadway with multi-use paths on both sides from Major Mackenzie Drive/Regional Road 50 to Mayfield Road, including at-grade intersection with Regional Road 50 until traffic operations indicate the need for a grade separation, and
- Widening of Coleraine Drive from 2 to 4 lanes with multi-use paths on both sides from Arterial A2 to Mayfield Road, including realignment of Coleraine Drive to connect with Arterial A2 west of Regional Road 50.



#### The Process

The Study for Part A was carried out in accordance with the requirements for 'Schedule C' projects as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015), which is an approved process under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. The City of Brampton previously completed the Area 47 Transportation Master Plan Study, which fulfilled the requirements for Phases 1 and 2 of the Class EA process. The City, in partnership with the Region, has now completed Phases 3 and 4 of the Class EA process for Part A. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Region intends to proceed with the detailed design and construction for the recommended improvements under Part A.

#### Comments invited:

The planning, consultation and preliminary design process that was undertaken for Part A has been documented in the Environmental Study Report (ESR). The ESR will be available for public review on the project website (City and Region) for 30 calendar days starting on **October 6, 2022** and **ending on November 7, 2022** (hard copy available at Gore Meadows Library Branch - 10150 The Gore Rd, Brampton, ON, L6P 0A6).

**Section 16 Orders**

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (i.e., requiring further studies) on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal or Treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. Requests should also include the requester contact information. This will ensure that the Ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
