

NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT REPORT – TRANSIT PROJECT ASSESSMENT PROCESS

New Brampton Transit Bus Maintenance and Storage Facility

The Project

The City of Brampton has completed an Environmental Project Report in accordance with *Ontario Regulation 231/08 for* a new Brampton Transit Bus Maintenance and Storage Facility located at the southwest corner of Highway 50 and Cadetta Road. The project aims to increase maintenance and storage capacity for existing and new buses, which are required to improve transit service in Brampton. The facility will include a storage area, maintenance garage, administrative offices and staff parking. A map of the study area is shown to the right.



The Process

The environmental impact of this transit project was assessed and an Environmental Project

Report prepared according to the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) as prescribed in *Ontario Regulation 231/08*, Transit Projects and Metrolinx Undertakings.

The Environmental Project Report for the new Brampton Transit Bus Maintenance and Storage Facility is now available for a 30-day review period from Thursday, March 18, 2021 to April 19, 2021 on the project website: https://www.brampton.ca/TransitFacility.

 The transit project may have a negative impact on a matter of provincial importance that relates to the natural environment or has cultural heritage value or interest; or,

 The transit project may have a negative impact on a constitutionally protected Aboriginal or treaty right.

Before exercising the authority referred to above, the Minister is required to consider any written objections to the transit project that they may receive within 30 days after the Notice of Completion of the Environmental Project Report is first published.

If you have discussed your issues with the proponent and you object to the project, you can provide a written submission to the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks no later than April 19, 2021 to the address provided below. All submissions must clearly indicate that an objection is being submitted and describe any negative impacts to matters of provincial importance (natural/cultural environment) or Aboriginal rights.

If not already provided, a copy of the objection will be forwarded to the proponent by the ministry.
